## Musky Water Classifications:

A1 - "Trophy waters" that consistently produce a number of large muskellunge, but overall abundance of muskellunge may be relatively low. Angling action can be inconsistent in these waters, but when conditions are right these waters can provide good action.

A2 - Waters are best known for providing the most consistent angling action with the potential to produce some larger fish. They generally have the best overall numbers of muskellunge, but big fish make up a small percent of the total, compared to the Class A1 waters.

B - This is an intermediate class of waters that provide good fishing. but angler success and catch rates may be somewhat less than in prime Class A waters.

# Fishing Licenses

**Fishing Licenses:** All 2019-2020 annual licenses are valid from date of purchase through March 31, 2020. Wisconsin Fishing Licenses can be purchased online at <https://gowild.wi.gov/> or at over 1,000 license agents.

**Resident Fishing Licenses:** Individual Annual- \$20, First-time Buyer - \$5, One Day - \$8, Married Couple - \$31, and Reduced Rate (Ages 16, 17 and 65 and older) - \$7, Disabled Person - \$7, Disabled Veteran - \$3, Active Armed Forces – No charge.

**Non-resident Fishing Licenses:** Individual Annual- \$50, Family Annual - \$65, First-time Buyer - \$25.75, One Day - \$10, Four Day - \$24, Fifteen Day Individual - \$28 and Fifteen Day Family - \$40.
